

Multiple-Entry Visas for Chinese Temporary Visitors

Chinese applicants going to Japan for business, visiting relatives/acquaintances, and tourism, etc. for 90 days or less multiple times.

-Chinese nationals residing in our jurisdiction may apply for a multiple-entry short-term visa if they have sufficient income/assets. Spouses, children, and parents of those with sufficient income/assets may also apply (In this case, they must apply at the same time as the main applicant or the main applicant must already have a multiple-entry visa.).

-Depending on the details of the application, a multiple-entry visa is issued (1) for stays of up to 90 days and a validity period of 5 years or (2) for stays of up to 30 days and a validity period of 3 years. As a result of review, a visa may be denied or a single- or double-entry visa may be issued.

-The applicant must have residence status in the US for a minimum of 3 years from the time of the application in order to be considered for a multiple-entry visa.

Applicants should submit the following documents. Additional documents may be requested during the course of review.

1. ALL application documents for the category of purpose of this trip. -Please check the required documents for each category of Business, Visiting Relatives/Acquaintances and Tourism.	
2. One of the following documents as a proof of sufficient income/assets. a. Monthly US bank statements for the last 6 months. b. A payslip. c. A Form 1040. d. A W-2 Form.	For spouses, children, and parents of the main applicant, <u>a document proving the kinship</u> is required instead of a proof of sufficient income/assets. For those applying for a multiple-entry visa after the main applicant has obtained a multiple-entry visa, <u>a copy of the main applicant's multiple-entry visa</u> is also required.
3. A statement explaining the reason the applicant needs a multiple-entry visa. -Please explain (i) detailed purpose of visit to Japan, (ii) reason(s) the applicant needs a multiple-entry visa, and (iii) future planned trips to Japan.
