Manson Professor of Clinical Tropical Medicine, London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM). Born 1938 in the UK.

He was awarded for his bold and innovative work in Malaria.

(N.B: He also won Canada Gairdner Global Health Award in March 2012 for contributions to significantly reducing mortality in children due to meningitis and acute respiratory infection and to contributions to malaria prevention.)

- (1) Dr. Greenwood established Africa-London-Nagasaki Scholarship Fund (ALN) in cooperation with LSHTM and Institute of Tropical Medicine (NEKKEN) Nagasaki University with the honorarium of the Prize.
